METHODOLOGY

From April to November 2025, Crisil Coalition Greenwich conducted interviews with 863 corporates globally in Asia, Europe, MENA, and the United States with annual revenues of USD\$2 billion or more for corporate banking, 944 corporates globally with annual revenues of USD\$2 billion or more in Asia, Europe, MENA, and the United States for corporate cash management, and 725 corporates globally in Asia, Canada, Europe, and the United States for foreign exchange.

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The data contained in the Document is based upon a particular bank's scope, which reflects a bank's data submission, business structure, and sales revenue Reporting methodology. As a result, any data contained in the Document may not be directly comparable to data presented to another bank. For franchise benchmarking, Crisil Coalition Greenwich has implemented equal ranking logic on aggregate results i.e., when sales revenues are within 5% of at least one competitor ahead, a tie is shown and designated by = (where actual ranks are shown). Entity level data has no equal ranking logic implemented and therefore, on occasion, the differences between rank bands can be very close mathematically.

The data in this Document may reflect the views reported to Crisil Coalition Greenwich by the research participants. Interviewees may be asked about their use of and demand for financial products and services and about investment practices in relevant financial markets. Crisil Coalition Greenwich compiles the data received, conducts statistical analysis and reviews for presentation purposes to produce the final results.

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
